Most people take hearing for granted and do so without much thought or effort. For those who develop hearing loss, everyday communication can be far less easy. The challenges are both practical and emotional, and there can be much to overcome to simply be understood.



Let's Loop the UK is an initiative of the charity Hearing Link, campaigning for greater use and awareness of hearing loops.

Let's Loop Swindon, one of the five Hearing Link projects in th UK, knows how beneficial hearing loops are. The group wants to ensure more hearing loops are made available and that they work throughout Swindon.

Volunteers in the Rotary Community Corps act like 'mystery shoppers' to check what's available and what isn't. The results are gathered and then passed back to the service provider so they know what improvement, if any, is needed. It is a simple but effective piece of community action.

The Let's Loop Swindon Steering Group is made up from a partnership of supporting organisations: Voluntary Action Swindon, Swindon Borough Council, Swindon Equality Coalition, Zurich Community Trust, Click 4 Action eRotary, the National Trust, as well as Hearing Link.
